MARITIME SECURITY A KEY FOCUS AT PACIFIC 2010

Organisers of next year's Pacific International Maritime Exposition have launched a new comprehensive conference program focusing on one of the key issues affecting Australia and the Asia Pacific Region.

'PACSEC 2010' will feature a series of international symposia dealing with the topical issues relating to civil and military maritime security.

Event CEO Ian Honnery says this unique new conference program called 'PACSEC 2010' will consolidate and enhance the exposition's expanding coverage of the key issue of maritime security.

"For some time, security has been at the forefront of Government strategy around the world," Mr Honnery says.

"PACSEC 2010 will provide a unique forum for the discussion of shared issues and common applications across both the civil and military sectors of maritime security."

The 'PACSEC 2010' program will incorporate maritime and port security, autonomous maritime surveillance systems, and maritime defence technology including under-sea and above water sensor integration.

PACIFIC 2010 will be held at the Sydney Convention and Exhibition Centre at Darling Harbour from January 27th-29th.

This biennial event has become internationally recognised as the premier commercial maritime and naval defence industry forum and trade exhibition in the region.

PACIFIC 2010 and its associated conference program, including 'PACSEC 2010' and the Royal Australian Navy's 'Sea Power Conference' and engineering focused 'Pacific International Maritime Conference' will bring together key industry, defence and government decision makers from around the globe.

In 2008, the Pacific event attracted almost 440 participating exhibitor companies from 22 nations, with attendances totaling 14,581 across the four days of the event.

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
